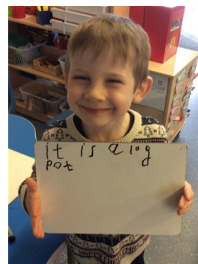
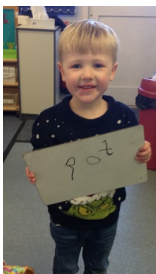
KS1 NATIVITY PERFORMANCE

Y3 REINDEER WRITING

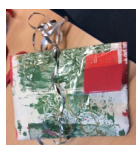


Y3 have been reading all about reindeer this week and doing some research too. They have produced some fantastic writing and some children have even written persuasive letters to suggest that we have a
